The Faith in Action Award rewards young people's active service in helping to build the Kingdom of God on Earth. Many young people are doing so much to follow Jesus' example in serving others in their schools and parishes. The award allows young people to be **recognised** within their church and school.

The programme facilitates an exploration of scripture and Church teaching, with an emphasis on translating this into action. It encourages young people to shine the light of faith upon their experience of service through guided and personal reflection.

The CYMFed Faith in Action Award was launched in 2016.

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Faith in Action Award is for young people aged 10-18 (Year 6 to Year 13). Young people undertake the award through their school, parish or organisation. No matter what level or age of the candidate, one question should always remain constant... *WHAT KIND OF PERSON AM I BECOMING?* 

> There are two sections in completing the award: 1. Credits (Active hours within the school and parish) 2. Reflection Point Sessions (Four to cover over the space of the year)



## WHAT IS EXPECTED FOR EACH LEVEL OF THE AWARD?

## PIN AWARD – SEEKING, SEARCHING



Year 6 and above.

Pin is all about discovery, discovery is highly important within this award as it is the foundation on which their Faith in Action Scheme will be built. The candidate should highlight the activities which they have taken part in and reflect on how these activities have had a positive effect in the life of themselves, the people they have met, and the wider life of the Church and society.

## BRONZE AWARD - BELONGING



The bronze award is all about service. When we look at the scripture from John 13 we are all called to be a servant of God.

It is also the first level in the award which asks the young people to be involved in the outside community as well as in their parish/school.

It's the first stepping stone in learning about authentic faith, being that it shows in all of their lives not just at Church. The candidate should display in their final piece what service they have offered to those around them and what they have learnt from serving others.

Young people don't need to have completed the Pin Award prior to this one.

## SILVER AWARD - VOCATION



Silver is focused on leadership.

Giving the young people the opportunity to grow more in their abilities, leading at whatever level is appropriate for them (not everyone can stand at the front).

It shows a commitment to being a key player in the mentorship of their brothers and sisters in faith. The final piece should outline the ways that the candidate has used their God given gifts to lead those around them, including what they have gained and any challenges they may have faced and how they overcame them.

Young people don't need to have completed the Bronze Award prior to this one but I would advise it as it allows progression throughout the award.

## GOLD AWARD - MISSION



Gold is about innovation, creating and helping fulfil the needs of those around them. When Jesus sent out the apostles he called them to be missionaries in the world, in the same way we too must become missionaries in our communities and the wider world.

It is the culmination of all the previous tiers' work focusing on the candidate's pioneering work in their communities, with a deeper understanding of why they're doing what they are. The final work should include evidence of them trying to cultivate new projects/groups to accommodate the spiritual as well as physical needs of those around them.

I would advise the minimum of Year 10 and above for this award level.

- Consider what all of the above is saying to 'me'

#### Reflection Point 1

#### WE ARE LOVED

In this reflection point, we will explore what it means to be loved. Using the parable of the Prodigal Son, we will reflect on how God's love for us is unconditional and everlasting. We will then discuss how our experience of love affects the way in which we live our lives and love one another.


Below are some resources to help you with the reflection point. A guided video led by the Animate Team, and some timetables with attached resources so that coordinators can lead the reflection point themselves.

# FINAL PIECES

- At the end of their award year, participants submit a final piece of work, drawing together their experiences during their FIA journey.
- Final pieces of work are moderated, not marked. This means it is not a pass or fail. If you send in a final piece, we will assume you are happy that all the necessary work has been done.
- The Final piece can be a video, poem, written reflection, song.
- If written, it should be no more than two sides of A4 paper.
- As creative as possible.
- The final piece should reflect the participant's experience and understanding.
- We only require at the end of the year the final pieces.
- It's the co- ordinators responsibility to sign off hours and to make sure the participants have done enough work to hand in a final piece.
- If someone has not done the hours / credits or attended the reflection point sessions, then do not ask them to complete the final piece this year (maybe save the hours done to next year?)





## JOURNALS

1. Journals aren't a requirement from the young people.

- 2. Although, over the past few years we have found that the young people have found value in keeping something which allows them to take notes and reflect during their Faith in Action experience.
- 3. This could be a notebook, a scrapbook or something which even allows you to keep track and moderate the young people throughout the award.
- 4. Please note these do not need to be handed in with the final pieces at the end of the year, this is purely for their own development during the award.
